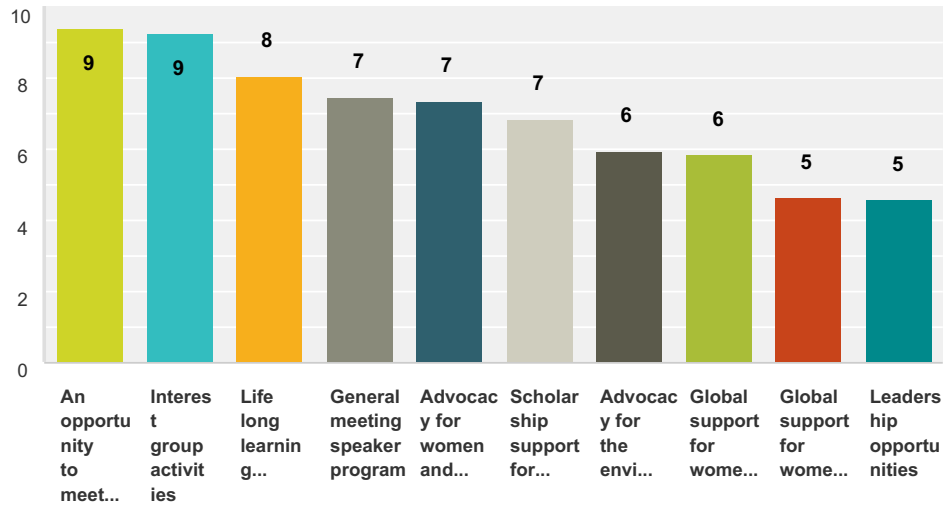

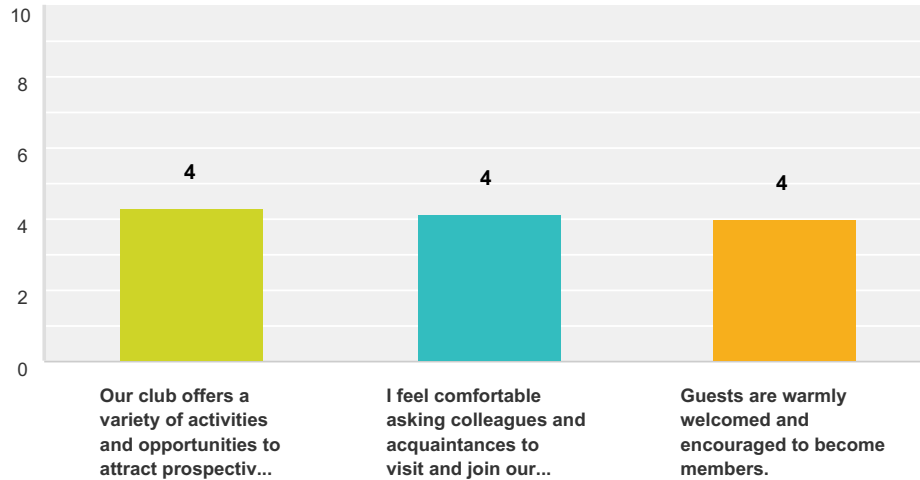

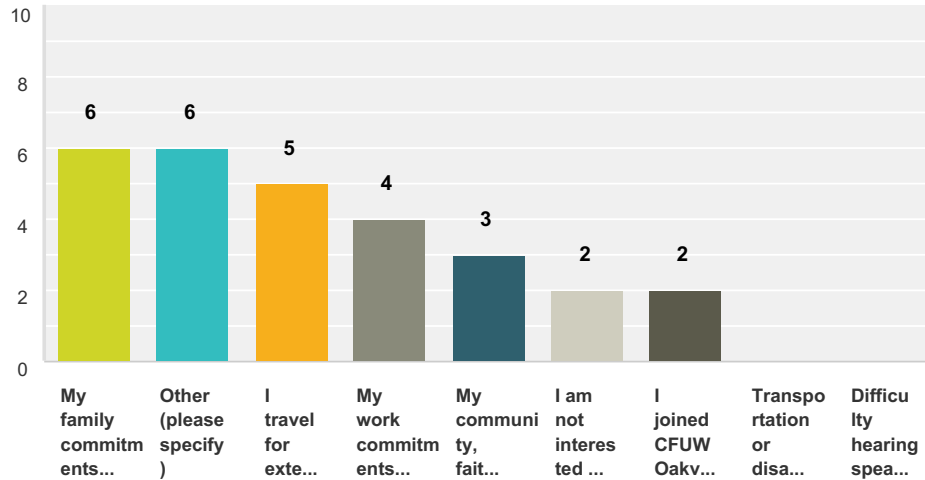

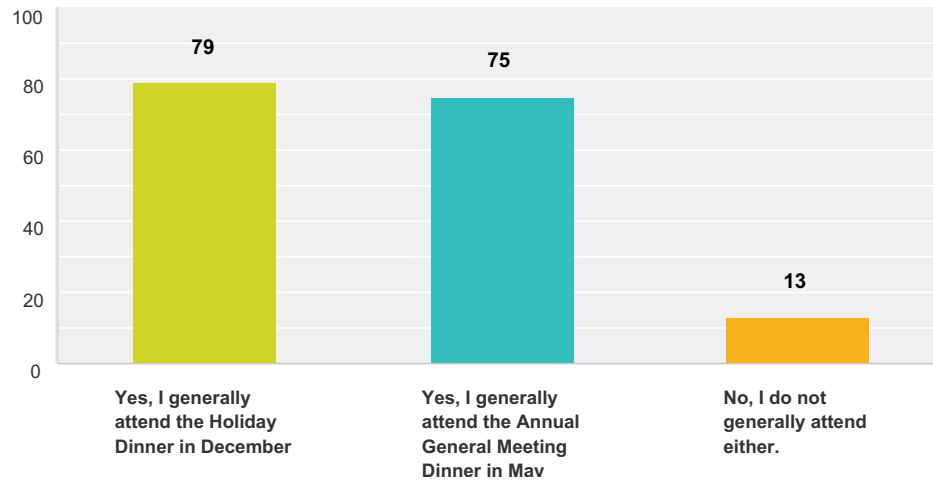

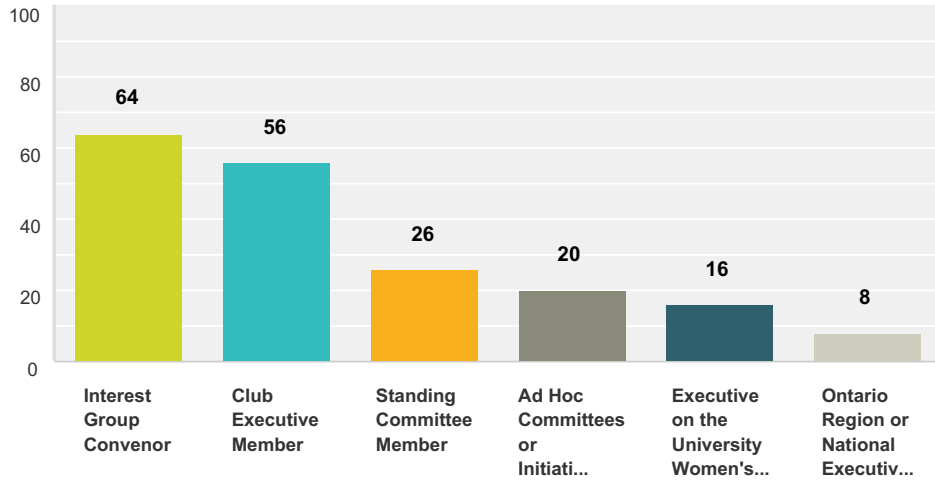

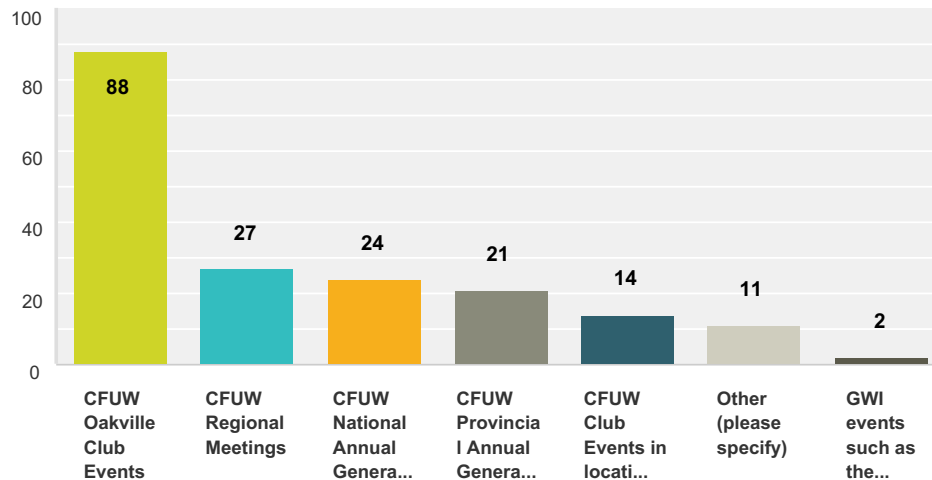

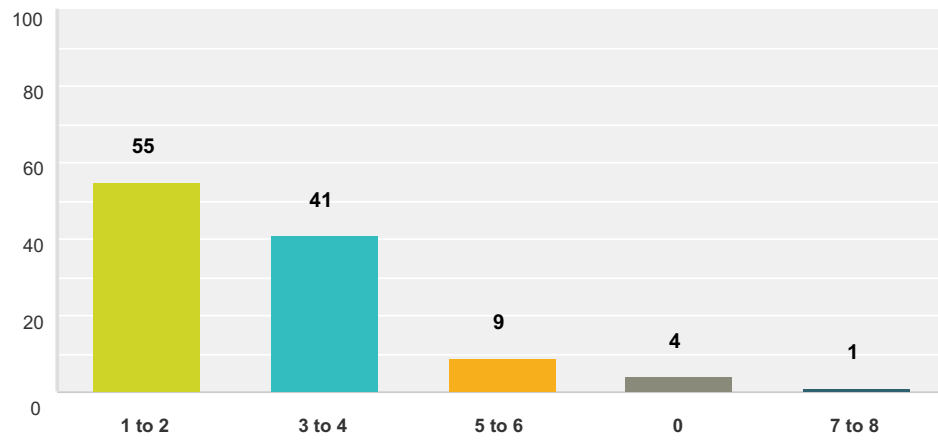

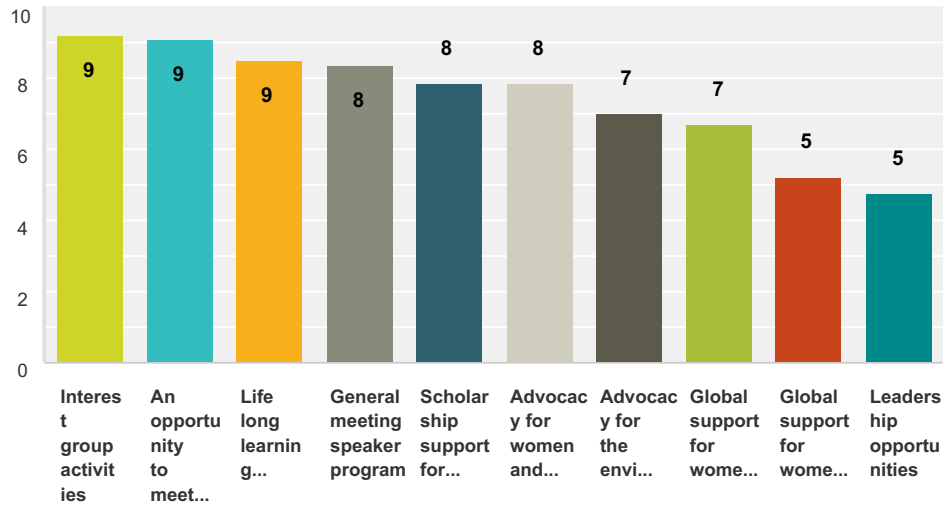

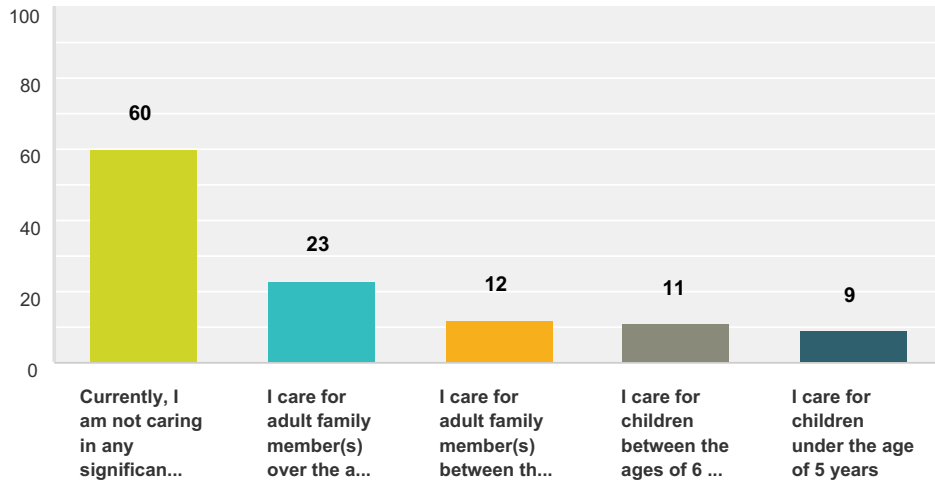

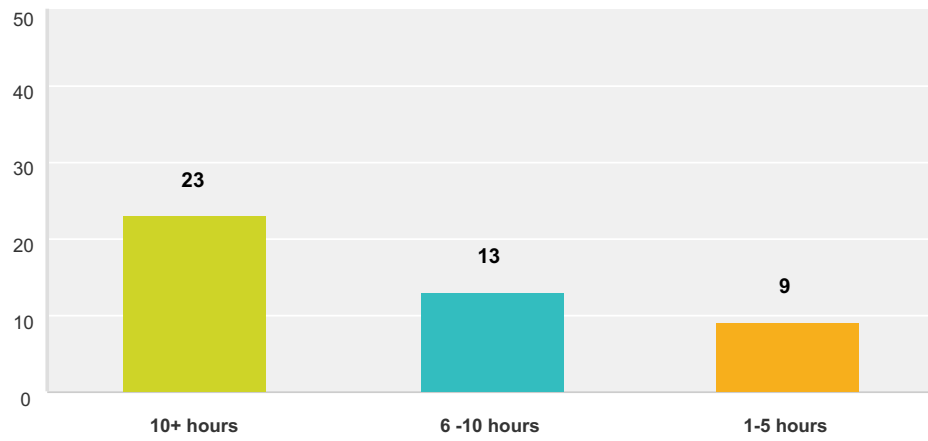

Q22 Please estimate how many hours per week you provide care to family members.

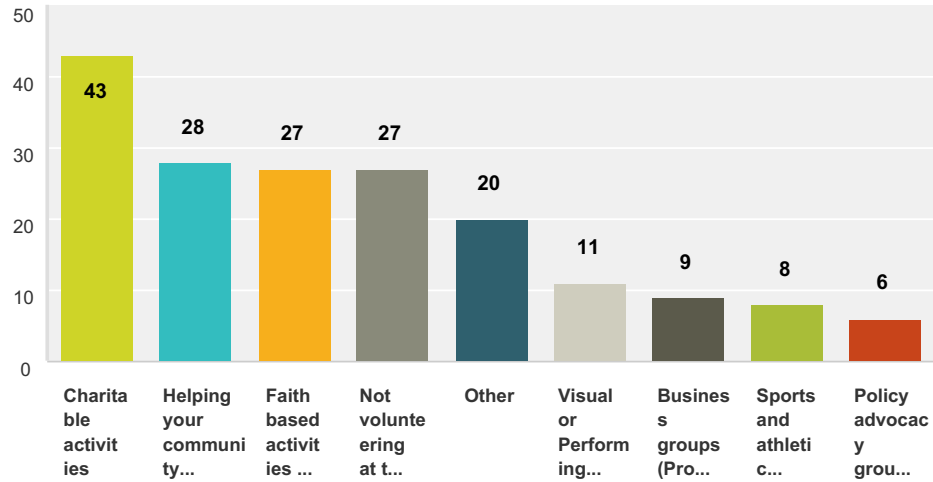

Q23 Please indicate if you currently volunteer your time for any of the following. Please check all that apply.

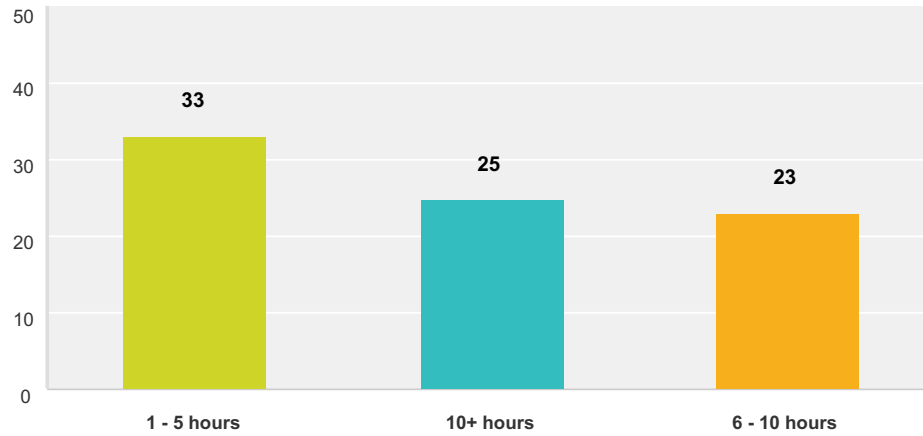

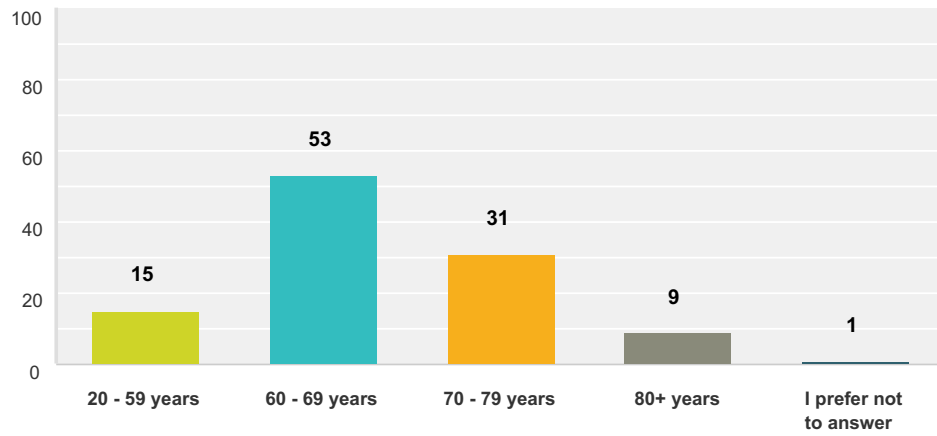

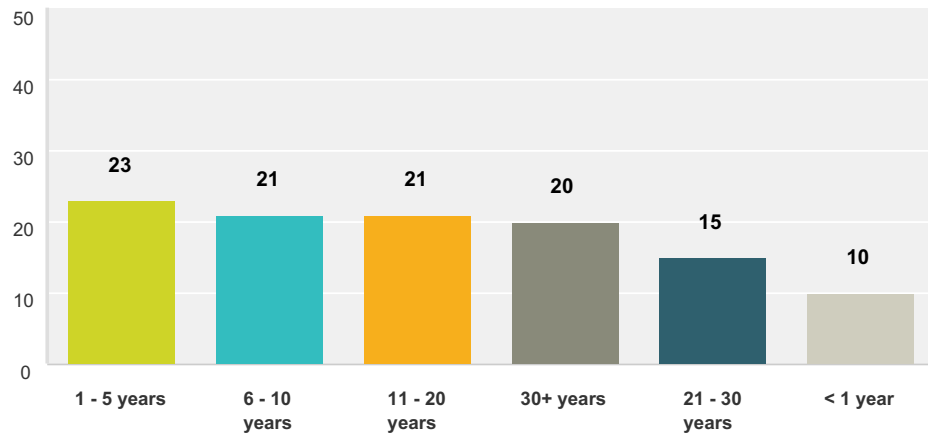
