

October's Speaker: **Bill Redelmeier Southbrook Organic Vineyards: a conversation on our commitment to quality** 

A passionate entrepreneur and connoisseur of food and fine wine, Bill Redelmeier, together with his partner Marilyn, evolved Bill's family business from a cattle farm on a 19th century property in Richmond Hill, through to a roadside vegetable stand in the 1980s, to a thriving garden market, and now an award-winning winery.

Bill's agricultural roots run deep – he honed his skills and knowledge at the University of Guelph and was an active supporter of local growers long before the expression "locavore" was coined.



In 2005, Bill chose to reinvest in agriculture by purchasing a 74-acre vineyard in the heart of Ontario wine country in Niagara-on-the-Lake. He doubled his holdings to approximately 150 acres of prime viticultural land in the spring of 2008. With this significant investment located within the Green Belt, Bill has intentionally chosen to become a part of this region's agricultural heritage for generations to come.

Bill has pursued certifications for both the vineyard and the winery – including LEED, biodynamic and organic certification – clearly demonstrating leadership and commitment to environmental concerns, quality winemaking, and outstanding customer experience.

### **Advocacy**

#### Introduction:

We are going to try something different this year. Through the newsletter each month, different members of Advocacy hope to highlight an issue which you may or may not be aware of. Anne Douglas started us off in the September issue with an article on health care. This month Bonnie Jensen highlights sepsis and its devastating outcome.

#### Sepsis in Ontario: Silent, Swift, Deadly - What you should know

Sepsis is defined as

"A life-threatening condition when the body's immune system has an extreme response to an infection causing organ dysfunction. "(World Health Organization).

It may progress quickly, lead to shock, multi-organ failure and death.

Some of the warning signs you should be aware of:

- Fever/extreme shivering
- Rapid breathing/shortness of breath
- Slurred speech/altered mental state
- Low or zero urine output
- Skin mottled or discoloured
- Feels like you are going to die

Those with a compromised immune system (age or comorbidity) are at much higher risk.

Recent Cases in the media in Ontario highlight the importance of early recognition and prompt treatment.

- 1. A 29-year-old Ontario woman died 2 days after delivering a healthy baby boy by C-section. Cause: Group A Strep Sepsis
- 2. A second woman in a post-partum unit died days after giving birth. The signs of serious infection were overlooked.
- 3. After a near fatal sepsis infection a child was airlifted 350 km to a hospital that could manage the illness. The child was initially sent home from the first hospital diagnosed with a viral infection.
- 4. A 16-year-old died in hospital after an 8-hour Emergency Room wait to see a doctor. His illness was later diagnosed as pneumonia and sepsis.

Sepsis is a medical emergency! Every hour counts.

Be informed.

Be aware.

Each one of us can help stop Sepsis and save lives.



What sets her apart is her unwavering dedication to ensuring everyone feels seen and valued.
